## MALAHAT FIRST NATION PROPERTY ASSESSMENT AMENDMENT LAW, 2018

## WHEREAS:

A. Pursuant to section 5 of the First Nations Fiscal Management Act (the "Act"), the Council of the Malahat First Nation enacted the Malahat First Nation Property Assessment Law, 2015; and

B. The Malahat First Nation Council deems it to be in the best interests of the First Nation to amend that law,

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Malahat First Nation duly enacts as follows:

- 1. This Law may be cited as the Malahat First Nation Property Assessment Amendment Law, 2018.
- 2. Subsection 22(2) of the *Malahat First Nation Property Assessment Law*, 2015, is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it with the following:
  - (2) The rates of remuneration for the Assessment Review Board are as follows:
  - (a) the chair or acting chair at the maximum per diem rate established from time to time by the Province for a part-time chair of a provincial administrative tribunal categorized as Group 3,
  - (b) a member or replacement member appointed to act, other than the chair, who meets the criteria set out in subsection 21(2), at the maximum per diem rate established from time to time by the Province for a part-time vice-chair of a provincial administrative tribunal categorized as Group 3, and
  - (c) a member or replacement member appointed to act, other than those referenced in paragraphs (a) and (b), at the maximum per diem rate established from time to time by the Province for a part-time member of a provincial administrative tribunal categorized as Group 3,

calculated in accordance with subsection (3).

3. This Law comes into force and effect on the day after it is approved by the First Nations Tax Commission.

THIS LAW IS HEREBY DULY ENACTED by Council at a duly convened meeting held on the 5th day of April 2018, at Mill Bay, in the province of British Columbia.

A quorum of the Council consists of (3) members of Council.
