Being a by-law to regulate the hours of stores

WHEREAS, paragraphs (c), (d), and (r) of Section 81 of the Indian Act empower the Council of a Band of Indians to enact by-laws respecting the observance of law and order, the prevention of disorderly conduct and nuisances, and the imposition of a penalty for the violation of such by-laws;

AND WHEREAS, the Council—of the Stony Rapids Band of Indians is of the opinion that the frequenting of stores by children during the late evening, and extra late hours for stores may not be conducive to orderly reserve life;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Stony Rapids Band of Indians enacts as a by-law thereof as follows:

- 1. In this by-law
  - (a) "Black Lake Community" means and includes all those lands lying within the following defined limits -
    - (i) Chicken Indian Reserve No. 224 (Black Lake unconfirmed) as shown on Plan No. 55457 in the Canada Lands Surveys Records at Ottawa.
    - (ii) Chicken Indian Reserve No. 225 (unconfirmed) as shown on Plan No. 53912 in the Canada Lands Surveys Records at Ottawa.
    - (iii) Chicken Indian Reserve No. 226 (unconfirmed) as shown on Plan No. 53911 in the Canada Lands Surveys Records at Ottawa.
  - (b) "business establishments" means any commercial establishment and without limiting the generality of the foregoing includes all retail stores, pool or billiard parlours and restaurants.
- 2. No person shall operate a business establishment within the Black Lake Community during the hours of 12:00 o'clock in the afternoon (midnight) and 08:00 o'clock in the forenoon on any day.
- 3. No person who owns or operates a business establishment within the Black Lake Community shall permit any boy or girl actually or apparently under 16 years of age to be present on such premises after the hour of 9:00 o'clock in the afternoon of any day unless accompanied by their parent or guardian.

- 4. Notwithstanding the foregoing the Chief of the Indian Band or his recognized designate may give permission, in writing, to the owner or operator of a business establishment exempting him from these conditions for special occasions.
- Any person who violates any of the provisions of this 5. by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days, or to both fine and imprisonment.
