That by-law to regulate trespass and nuisance of domestic animals at the Jacko Point Subdivision Nipissing Indian Reserve.

AND the Council of the Nipissing Band of Indians being authorized by the provisions of the Jacko Point Subdivision being part of the Nipissing Indian Reserve to regulate nuisances caused by domestic animals;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Nipissing Band of Indians has it to be necessary and in the best interests of residents residing at the Jacko Point Subdivision;

AND FURTHER the Council of the Nipissing Band of Indians acts under Section 81, subsection (d) and (e) of the Indian Act as a by-law
THEREOF;

1. That all persons shall keep domestic animals belonging to them within the confines of their individual properties.
2. That all persons shall secure domestic animals belonging to them are kept in such a manner that these domestic animals will not cause any undue nuisance to residents at the Jacko Point Subdivision.
3. Any person who violates any provision of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of not less than \$5 (5.00) Dollars nor more than ONE HUNDRED (\$100.00) Dollars and costs, or both a fine and imprisonment.
