WHEREAS the Band Council of the Islington Band #29 has the authority to make By-Laws for the better preservation of the safety and security of the members and residents of the Islington Band #29 Reserves;

AND WHEREAS the Band Council is desirous of protecting the peace, tranquility and good conduct of the members-citizens and residents of the Islington Band #29 Reserves by controlling the possession and sale of intoxicants and the conduct of intoxicated persons;

NOW THEREFORE the Band Council hereby enacts as a By-Law to be known as the Intoxication Control By-Law:

DEFINITIONS

1. Intoxicants: includes alcoholic, spirituous, vinous, fermented malt or other intoxicating liquor or combination of liquors and mixed liquor a part of which is spirituous, vinous, fermented or otherwise intoxicating and all drinks or drinkable liquids and all preparations or mixtures capable of human consumption that are intoxicating or intended to be used as human intoxicants.

Intoxicated: in addition to its ordinary meaning for the purposes of this By-Law means any person, who, being of the age of 18 years or less, and who has consumed intoxicants is deemed to be intoxicated.

- Traffic means: a) manufacture, give for the purpose of obtaining a profit therefrom, sell, barter, supply, transport, deliver or distribute, or
 - b) to offer to dc anything mentioned in paragraph(a);

"Trafficking" has a corresponding meaning.

PROHIBITION AGAINST TRAFFICKING IN INTOXICANTS & PENALTY

- 2. Everyone who:
 - a) trafficks in an intoxicant, or
 - b) is in possession of an intoxicant for the purpose of trafficking;
 - is guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction.
- 3. Every person who gives, supplies or provides by any means intoxicants to a person who is already intoxicated or that will cause that person to be deemed to be intoxicated is guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction.
- 4. Every person who contravenes either S.2 or S.3 of this By-Law is guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction and is liable to a fine of not more than ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) or imprisonment for a period not exceeding 6 months, or both.

PROHIBITION AGAINST INTOXICATION

5. Everyone who is intoxicated on the Reserves of the Islington Band #29 is guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction.

PROHIBITION ON 'POSSESSION OF INTOXICANTS

6. Everyone who is found in possession of intoxicants upon the Reserves of the Islington Band #29 is guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction.

PENALTY FOR POSSESSION OF INTOXICANTS & INTOXICATION

7. Every person who contravenes either S.5 or S.6 of this By-Law is guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction and is liable to a fine of not more than ONE HUNDRED DOLALRS (\$100.00), or imprisonment for a period not exceeding 3 months, or both.

EXCEPTIONS TO PROHIBITIONS

LAWFUL TRANSPORTATION & POSSESSION

- 8. Notwithstanding anything in this By-Law, no offence is committed if the person who is in possession of an intoxicant is:
 - a) transporting the intoxicant in an unopened state across the Reserve,
 - i) to a destination beyond the Reserve boundary with no intention to traffic the intoxicant upon the Reserve;
 - ii) to that person's home with no intention to traffic the intoxicant;
 - b) at his own home with no intention to traffic the intoxicant.

LAWFUL INTOXICATION

8.a) Notwithstanding any prohibition in this By-Law, no offence is c mmitted where a person is found intoxicated at his home or at a private dwelling to which he is, and remains, an invitee.

FOR GREATER CERETAINTY, the penalties for contravention of this By-Law are set out in The Indian Act.
