BY-LAW NUMBER 19

- (1) A By-Law to establish traffic regulations on all roads under the jurisdiction of the Saugeen Band Council.
- (2) In this By-Law
 "Band" shall mean the Saugeen Band of Indians.
 "Band Council" shall mean the Saugeen Indian Reserve number 29 Band Council.
 "Reserves" shall mean the Saugeen Indian Reserve number twenty-nine (29),
 the Chief's Point Indian Reserve number twenty-eight (28), the Saugeen Hunting
 Grounds number sixty (60), the Fishing Islands,
- (3) "Unsurrendered Lands" shall mean the Islands known as the Fishing Islands in Lake Huron along the west shore of the Bruce Peninsula, in the county of Bruce, province of Ontario and all the other lands that the Saugeen Band have an interest in.
- (4) "Roads" shall mean

(A) "road" includes any roadway, street, lane or other place open to the public for the passage of vehicles; and

- (B) "vehicles" shall mean any wagon, cart, motor car, motor truck, trailer, motorcycle, traction engine, road making machinery or other conveyance that is driven, propelled or drawn by any kind of power.
- (5) (A) These regulations may be cited as the Saugeen Reserve Traffic Regulations.

(B) These regulations apply on all roads within the Saugeen Band Council's jurisdiction.

- (6) The Indian Act shall mean
 The Indian Act R.S. c. 149, s. 1
- (7) (1) The driver of any vehicle shall bring such vehicle to a full stop when ordered to do so by any person authorized by the Saugeen Band Council to enforce these Regulations, and shall obey all directions issued by such authorized person in respect of the routing of control or traffic including the parking of vehicles.
 - (2) The driver of any vehicle shall comply with the direction of any mechanical or other device or sign installed for the control or routing of traffic.
 - (3) The driver of any vehicle shall not drive such vehicle over any road the use of which for public traffic is prohibited by any sign or other device.
- (8) The person in charge of any vehicle shall not drive or ride such vehicle at any rate of speed that is excessive or dangerous, having regard to the conditions then prevailing and such person shall keep such vehicle in such control when approaching a road intersection, or crossing for pedestrians or other purposes, as will enable him to prevent a collision with, or damage to, all other persons and vehicles.
- (9) The driver of any vehicle shall comply with all laws and regulations in force from time to time in the province in which the Indian Reserve is situated relating to motor vehicles, except such laws or regulations as are inconsistent with these regulations.

- (10) Ho person shall park or station any vehicle upon any road unless permission to do so is designated by signs erected over or marked on the roadway.
- (11) No vehicle in a dangerous or unsafe condition shall be operated on any road.
- (12) Any person who violates any of the provisions of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, upon summary conviction, to a penalty of not less than two (2) dollars and not more than Five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months, or both fine and imprisonment.
