## THE LONG LAKE BAND OF INDIANS (#77) BY-LAW #4

Being a by-law to regulate the operation of a motor vehicle in Long Lake Indian Reserve #77.

- WHEREAS under Section 81(b) and (c) of the Indian Act R.S., c. S.1, the Council of the Band is empowered to make by-laws to provide for the regulation of traffic on the reserve.
- AND WHEREAS it is deemed appropriate that the regulation of operation of a motor vehicle promote safety of reserve residents.
- NOW THEREFORE the Counicl of the Long Lake Land of Indians enacts as a by-law thereof the following:
- (1) In this by-law:
  - (a) "Council" means the Council of the Long Lake Band of Indians as defined in the Indian Act.
  - (b) "Police Officer" means any member of the R.C.M.P., Ontario Provincial Police or Band police force who is duly authorized to enforce law on the Reserve.
  - (c) "Reserve" means Long Lake Indian Reserve #77, set apart for the use of the Long Lake Band of Indians.
  - (d) "Restricted Zone" means any area of Long Lake Indian Reserve #77 posted by the Band Council as a restricted speed area.
  - (e) "Motorized Vehicle" means any vehicle other than one propelled by the physical effort of the operator, and includes sonomobiles, trucks, automobiles and motorcycles.
- (2) No person shall operate a car, truck, bu, skidoo or any other motorized vehicle on Long Lake #77 Reserve roads unless he or she is in possesion of a current drivers licence issued by the Province of Ontario, and qualifying the person to operate the type and class of motor vehicle involved.
- (3) No person shall operate a car, truck, bus, skidoo or any other vehicle on Long Lake #77 Reserve roads unless such person has insurance coverage issued by a registered Insurance Company. Such insurance must cover public liability and personal injury up to an amount no less than \$200,000.00 and be generally in accordance with the insurance requirements of the Province of Ontario for the operation of a motor vehicle on the provincial highway

and road networks.

- A police officer may issue a summons to the operator of a vehicle which in his opinion is violation by-law #4.
- The operation of a vehicle found to have committed the offence option of acknowledging guilt and paying the assessed fine within five days, or of applealing his summons in a court (5) of law.
