## THE LONG LAKE BAND OF INDIANS (#77) BY-LAW #3

Being a by-law to regulate the ownership and control of dogs on the reserve.

- WHEREAS under Section 81(a) of the Indian Act R.S., c. 149, S. 1 the Band is empowered to make by-laws to provide for the health of residents of the reserve.
- AND WHEREAS it is considered that a control on the ownership of dogs on the reserve is applicable to the general health and safety of residents.
- NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Long Lake Band of Indians enacts as a by-law thereof the following:
- (1) In this by-law:
  - (a) "Council" means Council of the Long Lake Band of Indians as defined in the Indian Act.
  - (b) "Reserve" means Long Lake Indian Reserve #77, set apart for the use of the Band.
  - (c) "Dog Control Officer" means the person appointed from time to time by Council for the purpose of controlling dogs on the Reserve, referred to in Section (2) by-law.
- (2) Council will appoint a Dog Control Officer for the purpose of enforcing this by-law.
- (3) All dogs will be registered on an annual basis no later than March 31st each year.
- (4) The registration fee will be two dollars for a male or nuctored female deg, and five dellars for a female deg.
- (5) Council will at the time of registration, provide the dog-owner with a receipt and numbered "dog-tag" for each dog registered.
- (6) No dog shall be allowed to run at large in populated areas of the reserve, unless accompanied by the owner or other responsible person capable of exercising control over the animal.
- (7) No family shall be permitted to own more than two pet dogs or four working dogs or two pet dogs and four working dogs.
- (8) The dog control officer may capture any dog which is deemed, in his opion, to be running at large and causing a public nuisance, and the owner of the dog will be allowed

to redeem the animal within a forty-eight hour period, after which time the dog may be destroyed.

- (9) The fee payable for redemtion of a captured dog will be ten dollars for the first offence and therefore twenty dollars each time.
- (10) Any person who violates the provison of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and liable on summary conviction to a fine of twenty-five dollars or imprisonment for a period of five days or both such fine and imprisonment.
