THE FORT HOPE BAND OF INDIANS

BY-LAW #4

Being a by-law to regulate the carrying of knives on Fort Hope Reserve #64.

WHEREAS under Section 81(d) of the Indian Act R.S., c. 149, S.1 the Council of the Band is empowered to make by-laws to provide for the prevention of disorderly conduct and nuisance on the reserve.

AND WHEREAS it is considered that the control of knives will be instrumental in promoting the safety of reserve residents.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Fort Hope Band of Indians enacts as a by-law thereof the following:

(1) In this by-law:

- (a) "Council" means the Council of the Fort Hope Band of Indians as defined in the Indian Act.
- (b) "Police Officer" means any member of the R.C.M.P., Ontario Provincial Police or Band police force who is duly authorized to enforce law on the reserve.
- (c) "Reserve" means Fort Hope Indian Reserve No. 64, set apart for the use of the Fort Hope Band of Indians.
- (d) "Knife" means any hunting, butcher or other knife with a blade exceeding four inches in length when measured from the tip of the blade to the shank.

(2) No one shall carry a knife on his/her person, except within the boundaries of residential property normally occupied by him/her from within the following defined areas unless enroute to areas outside the community such as hunting or fishing grounds.

(3) A police officer may arrest any person on Fort Hope Reserve whom he finds violating any provision of this by-law.

(4) Any person found guilty on summary conviction of a violation of any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence, and is liable to the payment of a fine of twenty-five dollars or imprisonment for a period not exceeding five days or both fine and imprisonment.
