Jwelfth the Council of the Tokis Rand of Indians at a resting held the Jwelfth day of July , July , makes the following by-law pursuant to paragraphs (o) and (r) of Jection 30 of the Indian Act.

PISHING

- 1. He person, other than a member of the band, shall be permitted to fish in the reserve without first obtaining a written permit to so do from the person authorized by the Council to grant such permission.
- 2. Parmits may be obtained only on production of a valid and substating (name) Provincial iloence, if such is required by the person applying, to fish in provincial waters contiguous to the reserve.
- J. Such permit shall authorise the permittee to fish by engling only and may be subject to a fee established from time to time by resolution of the Council of the Nami.
- h. To person, under authority of such permit, shall fish for, take or attempt to take in one day,
 - (a) nore than six large mouth or aix small mouth black base or any outbination of six thereof
 - (b) more than two mackings
 - (c) ours than six yellow pickerel
 - (d) more than six piles
 - (c) more than live lake trout
 - (f) core than one sturgeon
 - (E) more than two perch
 - (h) more than twenty crappies
 - (1) more than twenty fish in the aggregate in all species mentioned above.
- 5. No person chall retain, keep out of water or have in his possession,
 - (a) any black base of a total length less than eleven inches
 - (b) any maskimonge of a total length less than thirty inches
 - (c) any yellow pickerel of a total length less than fifteen inches
 - (d) my pase of a total length less than eighteen laches
 - (c) any lake trout of a total length less than fifteen inches
 - (f) any sturgeon other than the first studeon taken or caught regardless of size.
- 6. No person shall retain, keep out of water or have in his possession more than one day's limit as set out in Section 4 and 5 of this by-law.
- 7. The definition of angling, open and closed season, course fish, game fish, resident, total length, yellow pickers and all other matters not specifically contioned in this by-law shall be as provided in the Special History Regulations for the Province of Interio.

HUNTING

- 8. No person, other than a member of the band or the holder under lease of shouting rights in any part of the reserve, shall be permitted to trap or hunt in the reserve without first obtaining a written permit so to do from the person authorized by the Council to grant such permission.
- 9. Holders of permits to hunt or trap as outlined in Section 6 must be accompanied by a member of the Dokis Eand duly licensed to act as a guide.
- 10. Fermits may be obtained only on production of a valid and subsisting Ontario Provincial Licence, if such is required by the person applying, and may be subject to a fee established from time to time by the Council of the Band.
- 11. Open season, bag limits, possession limits and all other matters not provided for in this by-law shall be, with respect to ducks, as set out in regulations for the Province of Ontario made under authority of the Migratory Birds Convention Act and, with respect to other game, as provided in the regulations made under the Ontario Came Act for the contiguous provincial lands.
- 12. All Eand mambers before being permitted to act as guides must register with the person authorized by the Council to receive such registration who will issue free of charge to each Band member who registers a licence to guide on the Pokis Indian Reserve Hor. Any person who engages in acting as a guide without being in possession of a licence shall be guilty of an offence.
- 13. Every guide licensed under Section 12 of the by-law is required to abide by the rules and regulations set down by the Council for the instruction of guides and failure to do so will result in the revoking of the licence to guide.
- th. Any person who violates the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on extendary conviction to a fine not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$100.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 30 days or both fine and imprisonment.
- 15. With the coming into force of this by-law, By-law No. 1 made by the Council of the Pokis Band at a meeting held on January 9, 1957, shall cease to be in force.
