

The Council of the Christian Island Band of Indians at a meeting held on August 6, 1960 makes the following by-law pursuant to paragraphs (a) and (r) of Section 80 of the Indian Act.

By-law No. 1

A by-law for the protection, preservation and management of pheasants on the Christian Island Indian Reserve in the Province of Ontario.

1. This by-law shall apply within the boundaries of the Christian Island Indian Reserve for a period commencing on the date of execution thereof and ending on April 15, 1961.
2. Persons other than members of the Band may hunt pheasants within the boundaries of the above mentioned Reserve subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the Council of the Band and without restricting the generality of the foregoing, such conditions may include:
  - (a) Payment of Fees; \$10.00 per gun per day, each person allowed only one gun per hunter and each hunter is allowed two birds game limit per day, no guarantee.
  - (a 1) \$16.00 per gun per day, each hunter being allowed one gun only and to each hunter allowed two birds game limit per day, guaranteed kill (if gun is not shot, the hunter is given two dressed pheasants of the Chief's).
  - Employment of guides; Each party of four hunters is required to have a guide. Guide's fees will be \$20.00 per guide per day or \$4.00 per half day. It will be the responsibility of the guide to obtain eight birds from the gun to be fluffed for the hunters sport and all eight birds will be released simultaneously at a distance no less than fifty yards from the hunters guns.
  - Open and close season; September 15, 1960 to March 31, 1961, hours of hunting will be between 9:30 A.M. to 12:00 A.M. and between 1:30 P.M. and 4:30 P.M.
  - (a) Bag limits; Two birds per gun, over bag limit \$4.00 per extra shot.
3. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this by-law shall on summary conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days or both fine and imprisonment.
