By LAW 5 The Cou. ... of the Kettle Point Ban. of Indians at a meeting held on the . day of August, 1965, makes the following by-law pursuant to Section 80 of The Indian Act. Whereas the Kettle Point Band of Indians are descendents of that part of the Chippowa Nation of Indians which granted large

areas in Western Ontario to the Crown by Treaty dated July 10th, 1827.

And whereas the forefathers of the Kettle Point Indians did not grant to the Crown any of their rights in the lands underlying Lake Huron, the Kettle Point Indians do assert their ancient and undoubted rights in such lands under lake lluron.

And whoroug the Council of the Kettle Point Band of Indians decor it expedient to pass a by-law respecting fishing on the Kettle Feint Reserve and on the lands underlying Lake Huron.

Ind whoreas the Council of the Kettle Point Band of Indiana further dome it expedient to pace a by-law relating to the hunting and taking of game and game birds on the Kettle Point Reserve and on the lando underlying lake Huron adjacent to the Reservo.

NOW THE COURCIL OF THE DAND OF KETTLE POINT INDIANS enacts as follows:

FIGHTIK

- 1. No porson, other than a newbor of the Band, chall be permitted to fish in the Reserve or on the waters of Luke Buron running northerly between the empterly and westerly limits of the Nottle Point Reserve for a distance of ten miles without first obtaining a written permit to do so from the person authorised by the Council to great such permission.
- 2. Such parait shall authorize the permittee to flah by anyling only and may be milject to a fee established from time to time by resolution of the Council of the Band.
- llo person, under such ority of such permit, shall fish for, take 3. or attempt to take in one day,
 - (a) nore than six large mouth or six small wouth black bass or any combination of six thereof

(b) more than two maskinenge more than aix yellow pickerel

more than five lake trout nore than one sturgeon

more than ten perch

more than twenty crappion more than twenty fish in the aggregate in all species. mentioned above.

No person shall retain; keep out of water or nave in mis LOBSOSSION,

any bluck bass of a total length less than eleven inches any mankinongs of a total length less than thirty inches any yellow pickerel of a total length less than fifteen

inches

any pike of a total longth loss than eithtem inches any lake trout of a total longth loss than Afteen inches (a) any sturgeon other than the first sturgeon taken or caught regardless of disc.

- No person shall retain, keep out of water or have in his 5. consession word than one day's limit as set out in Sections I und 4 of this by-law.
- mo definition of angling, open and close season, course fish, ΰ, gazo fint, resident, total length, yellow pickeral and all . other mattern not specifically mentioned in this by-law shall be as provided in the Special Fishery Regulations for the Frovince of Ontario.

HUNTARO

- 7. No person, other than a member of the Band or the holder under lensu of abouting rights in any part of the Reserve, or on the waters of lake theren running mortherly from the Reserve between the easterly and westerly limits thereof for a distance of ten miles, whall be permitted to hunt in the Reserve or on the aforguentioned waters of lake Huron without first obtaining a written permit so to do from the person authorized by the Council to grant much paraisolon.
- y. Holders of permits to hunt as outlined in Jection 7 aust be accompanied by a manber of the Kettle Point Dand of Indians duly licensed to act us a guide.
- ソ. Open neason, bug limits, possession limits and all other matters not provided for in this by-law shall be, with respect to dicks, as set out in regulations for the Frovince of Outario made under authority of the Migratory Birds Convention Act and, with respect to other gene, as provided in the regulations ands under the Unturio Gamo Act for the contiguous provincial Lands.
- 10. All Band manbers before being paralted to not us guides must register with the person authorized by the Council to receive such registration who will ignue free of charge to each Band member who registers a liquico to guide on the liettle Point

- 11. Every guide licensed under Section 10 of the by-law is required to abide by the rules and regulations set down by the Council for the instruction of guides and failure to do so will result in the revoking of the licence to guide.
- 12. Any person who violates the provisions of this by-law compained in Items 1 to 9 inclusive shall be guilty of an offence and shall be limble on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$100.00 or imprisonment for a term of not exceeding thirty days or both fine and imprisonment.
