THE TAHLTAN BAND OF INDIANS

By-law 3-75

Being a by-law to provide for the control and the licencing of dogs.

WHEREAS Paragraph (e) and (r) of Section 81 of the Indian Act empower the Council of a Band to make by-laws respecting the control of animals and the imposition of a penalty for the violation thereof;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed to be expedient for the welfare of the inhabitants of the Telegraph I. R. #6 to license and regulate animals;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Tahltan Band of Indians enacts as a by-law thereof the following:

1. The head of each family and each person living alone desiring to keep a dog shall apply to the Tahltan Band Council and shall obtain a permit for such dog upon payment of a tax, the amount of which shall be established by the Council of the band; such permit shall be for one year and the issue and renewal thereof shall be at the discretion of the Tahltan Band Council.
2. (a) The Tahltan Band Council shall keep a book for the registration of all dogs upon the reserve which registration shall show the name of the owner, the sex and description of the dog; the tax payable shall be collected at the time of registration.
(b) Upon registration the Tahltan Band Council shall issue a registration tag, which shall be attached to the dog at all times; any change of ownership of any registered dog shall be entered in the register.
3. (a) Tax in the amount of \$5.00 (Five dollars) shall be charged and collected each calendar year for each female dog.
(b) Tax in the amount of \$3.00 (Three dollars) shall be charged and collected each calendar year for each male dog.
4. No owner of a dog or dogs shall leave said dog unattended on the reserve when the owner temporarily leaves the reserve.
5. Any person in possession of a dog or dogs that have not been registered and own no dog tag shall have caused an offense against this by-law and shall be responsible for the destruction of that dog and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$50.00 (Fifty dollars) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen days, or both fine and imprisonment.
