in accordance with paragraphs (c), (d), (g) and (h) of Section 80 of the Indian Act.
 By-law No. 4 - - - - A by-law to provide for the regulations of the activities of boys and
~~and girls~~ girls on the Masset #1 Indian Reserve, actually or apparently under 16 years
 of age.

- 1) No boy or girl on the Masset #1 Indian Reserve actually or apparently under 16 years of age, shall loiter any place within the Masset #1 Indian Reserve after nine o'clock in the afternoon.
- 2) Subject to paragraph (c) no boy or girl on the Masset #1 Indian Reserve actually or apparently under 16 years of age, shall be in any place of entertainment, street, lane, by-way or common within the said reserve after the hour of nine o'clock in the afternoon unless accompanied by his or her parent or an adult appointed by a parent to accompany such child.
- 3) No boy or girl on the Masset #1 Indian Reserve actually or apparently under 16 years of age, shall be in any place of entertainment, street, lane, by-way or common within the said reserve after the hour of eleven o'clock in the afternoon during the months of July and August unless accompanied by his or her parent or an adult appointed by a parent to accompany such child.
- 4) A boy or girl on the Masset #1 Indian Reserve found violating the provisions of Paragraph (a), (b), or (c) may be warned and conducted home by a police officer and if the warning is not regarded or after the warning the boy or girl is again found disobeying said paragraph (a), (b) or (c) the parents of such boy or girl shall be directed to meet with the Advisory Committee appointed by the council of the Band for the protection of the children.
- 5) A parent who permits his child to violate paragraph (a), (b), or (c) shall be guilty of an offense and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$5.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding seven days, or both fine and imprisonment.
