THE GINGOLX FIRST NATION

BY-LAW NO. 13

INTOXICANTS TO MINORS BY-LAW

WHEREAS the Gingolx Village Government considers it necessary to undertake measures for the protection of the minors in the community.

WHEREAS the Council of the Band is declaring in effect a prohibition against the supply of intoxicants to minors; and intoxicated public nuisances.

WHEREAS Subsection 85.1 (1) of the Indian Act authorizes the Council of a Band to make by-laws:

- a) prohibiting the supply of Intoxicants to minors.
- b) prohibiting people under the influence from disturbing the community members.

WHEREAS subsection 85.1 (4) of the Indian Act provides that every person who contravenes a by-law made under this section is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction, in the case of a by-law made under paragraph 85.1(1)(a), to a fine of not more than one thousand dollars or alternative justice to be initiated by the community of Gingolx or to both; and in the case of a bylaw made under paragraph 85.1 (1) (b) or paragraph 85.1 (1) (c), to a fine of not than one hundred dollars or alternative justice to be initiated by the community of Gingolx or to both;

AND WHEREAS as a majority of the electors of the Band who attended a special meeting of the Gingolx First Nation on July 30, 1998 called by the council of the Gingolx First Nation on May 20, 1998 for the purpose of considering the contents of this bylaw, assented to the contents of this bylaw,

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby pursuant to Section 85.1 of the Indian Act, and the Young Offenders Act:



Short Title

1. This by-law may be cited as the Gingolx Village Government Intoxicant to Minors By-law.

Interpretation

2. In this bylaw:

"Band" means the Gingolx First Nation:

"Intoxicant" means any fermented liquid spirits or mind-altering drug:

"Intoxicated" means being under the influence of an intoxicant;

Prohibitions

3. No person shall sell, barter, or supply an intoxicant to any minor.

Convictions


4. Where evidence has proven an individual guilty and the same being served with a "ticket" by the Community's By-Law Officers, the individual will appear either before "Crown Counsel" or alternative justice that is controlled and initiated by the community.

Gingolx First Nation this 30th day of July, 1998.






