THIS BY-LAW MAY BE CITED AS THE "TANAKTEUK INDIAN BAND HUNTING AND GAME PROTECTION BY-LAW, 1986, NO.2."

Definitions:

- 1. In this By-Law, unless the context otherwise requires:
 - (a) "Band Council" means the duly elected council of the Tanakteuk Band of Indians.
 - (b) "Band Members" means any member of the Tanakteuk Band of Indians registered as such pursuant to the Indian Act.
 - (c) "Tanakteuk Band Lands" means those tracts of land that have been set apart as reserves for the use and benefit of the Tanakteuk Band of Indians.
 - (d) "Game" means migratory birds, moose, deer, wolf, bears (black and grizzly), mountain goat, martin, weasel, squirrel, otter, mink, beaver, cougar, ptarmigan, willow grouse, blue grouse.
 - (e) "Hunting" means hunting for, catching or attempting to catch any fur bearing animals or migratory birds by firearms of appropriate caliber, or regulation traps.
 - (f) "Warden" means a person(s) who is a member of this band, appointed by the Council for the purpose of this By-Law.
 - (g) "Permit" means a written document from Band Council as, Appendix "A" attached, which authorizes the permittee to hunt specific game on Tanakteuk Band Lands.

Jurisdiction:

2. This By-Law applies to Tanakteuk Band Lands.

Game Management Personnel:

3. Band Council may appoint any person(s) who is a member of this Band to act as Game Warden to enforce this By-Law and to maintain liaison with Ministry of Environment personnel in the interest and conservation of game.

TANAKTEUK INDIAN BAND HUNTING AND GAME PROTECTION BY-LAW, 1986, NO.2 PAGE TWO

Hunting:

- 4. No person other than a band member may engage in hunting on Tanakteuk Band Lands without a permit issued by the Tanakteuk Band Council. There will be no charge for permits. Permits may be issued only to members of Indian Bands other than the Tanakteuk Band members.
- 5. Open season, bag limits, possession limits and all other matters with respect to hunting not provided for in this By-Law shall be, with respect to ducks and other migratory birds, as set out in the Regulations for the Province of British Columbia made under authority of the Migratory Birds Conservation Act and, with respect to other Wildlife, as provided in the Regulations made under the Wildlife Act, Province of British Columbia, for the adjacent lands.

Prohibition:

- 6. No person shall destroy game by any means other than by hunting as authorized by this By-Law.
- 7. Any warden for the enforcement of this By-Law shall forthwith seize all game protected by this By-Law which is found by him in possession of any person, other than a member of the Tanakteuk Band who is not in possession of a permit under Section 4 of this By-Law.

Special Orders:

8. Notwithstanding Section 4, by a Special Order issued by the Tanakteuk Band Council in co-operation with the Ministry of Environment, hunting at any time and any place may be prohibited for reasons of declining herds or for any reason based on the preservation, protection and management of game.

Violation:

Councillor

9. Every person who violates any provision of this By-Law is guilty of an offense and is punishable on summary conviction of a fine of not more than One Thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or to imprisonment for not more than Thirty (30) days, or both fine and imprisonment.
