



The Council of The Pas Band of Indians at a meeting held this 29th day of May, 1979, hereby enacts by-law number 13 to provide for the regulation of Hawkers and Peddlers within the boundaries of The Pas Indian Reserve.

WHEREAS, paragraphs (n) and (r) of Section 81 of the Indian Act empowers the Council of a Band to make a by-law respecting the regulations of the conduct and activities of Hawkers and Peddlers and the imposition of a penalty for a violation thereof, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary to limit and control the activities of Hawkers and Peddlers for the benefit and welfare of the residents of The Pas Indian Reserve.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of The Pas Band of Indians enacts as a by-law thereof the following:

1. In this by-law,
 - (a) "Council of the Band" means the Council of The Pas Band of Indians;
 - (b) "Reserve" means the tract of land as defined in the Indian Act;
 - (c) "Vehicle" means any conveyance that is driven, propelled, or drawn by and kind of power;
 - (d) "Hawker & Peddler" means a person who swaps, traffics, buys, sells, barter, trades, and deals in wares or merchandise and solicits any personal services.
2. No Hawker, Peddler shall enter upon The Pas Indian Reserve without the written consent of the Band Council.
3. The Band Council shall provide a licencing fee schedule to all Hawkers and Peddlers who wish to do business on the Reserve.
4. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on a summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$100.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty (30) days or both fine and imprisonment. And any merchandise being sold without a permit may be confiscated and will be disposed of as Council sees fit if the fine imposed under this section is not paid within 10 days of the offense.

A quorum for this Band consists of 5 Council members.
