





BYLAW

The Council of the Caughnawaga Indian Band at a meeting held this 10th tenth day of April 1965 make the following bylaw pursuant to paragraphs (C) and (D) of Section 80 of the Indian Act.

By-Law No. 3/65-66

A by-law to provide for the prevention of disorderly conduct and nuisance on the Caughnawaga Indian Reserve in the Province of Quebec.

1- In this by-law

(a) "Special constable" means a person appointed pursuant to Section 10 of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Act, R.S.C. 1959, C. 54 for the purpose of maintaining law and order on the Caughnawaga Indian Reserve;

(b) "public place" includes any place to which the public have access as of right or by invitation express or implied.

2- No person shall cause a disturbance in or near a public place.

(a) by fighting, screaming, shouting, swearing, singing, or using insulting or obscene language;

(b) by being drunk or

(c) by impeding or molesting other persons.

3- No person shall openly expose or exhibit an indecent exhibition in a public place or commit any act in a public place which offends against public decency or order.

4- No person shall loiter in a public place or in any way obstruct persons who are there.

5- No person shall disturb the peace and quiet of the occupants of a dwelling house by discharging fire-arms, or by other disorderly conduct in a public place, or dwelling house.

6- No person shall without lawful excuse, the proof of which lies upon him, prowl or loiter by day or by night upon the property of another near a dwelling house situated on that property without the owner's permission either express or implied.

7- The special constable shall have the power and authority to arrest any persons who violates any of the provisions of this by-law.

8- No person shall resist or wilfully obstruct a special constable in the execution of his duty or any person lawfully acting in aiding such an officer.

9- No person shall omit without reasonable excuse to assist a special constable in the execution of his duty in arresting a person or in preserving the peace after having reasonable notice that he is required to do so.

10- Any person who violates any provision of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$100.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 30 days or both fine and imprisonment.
