The Council of the Onion Lake Band of Indians at a meeting held November 18, 1953, makes the following bylaw pursuant to paragraph (d) and (p) of section 80 of the Indian Act.

Bylaw No. 1

A bylaw to provide for the regulation of trespass and nuisance in the Onion Lake Indian Reserve in the province of Saskatchewan.

- (a) No unauthorized person shall frequent the premises of the schools to the extent of being a nuisance to teacher and pupils.
- (b) No person, non-Indian or Indian who is not a member of the band, against whom a complaint has been laid before the band council or whom the band council consider to be an undesirable person will be permitted to stay on the Reserve.
- (c) Any person who violates any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary convictions to a fine not exceeding ten dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding seven days, or both fine and imprisonment.
