



The Council of the Onion Lake Band of Indians at a meeting held *at Onion Lake, Sask.*, makes the following by-law pursuant to paragraphs (e) and (r) of Section 80 of the Indian Act.

By-law No. *2*.....

A by-law to provide for the protection against and prevention of trespass by cattle and other domestic animals on the Onion Lake Indian Reserve in the Provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan.

- (a) No person, other than a member of the Onion Lake Indian Band, shall permit any cattle or other domestic animals owned by him or reputed to be in his care or possession to run at large on any part of the Onion Lake Indian Reserve.
- (b) The chief, or any other person authorized by the council of the band, may cause any cattle or other animals found running at large on the reserve to be removed therefrom.
- (c) If any person, other than a member of the band, permits any cattle or animals owned by him or in his care or possession to trespass on the reserve, such person may be required orally or in writing by the chief, or any person authorized by the council of the band, to remove such cattle or other animals from the reserve within forty-eight hours.
- (d) If any person, after he has been notified as aforesaid, does not remove such cattle or other animals from the reserve, or after any cattle or other animals owned by him or in his care and possession have been removed, causes or permits any cattle or other animals owned by him or in his care or possession to return to said reserve, he shall be deemed guilty of a breach of the provisions of this by-law.
- (e) Any person who violates any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days, or both fine and imprisonment.
