



The Council of the Onion Lake Band of Indians at a meeting to parry apple (6) and (r) of Section 80 of the Indian law pursus Act.

By-Law No.

A by-law to provide for the protection against and prevention of trespass by cattle and other domestic animals on the Onion Lake Indian Reserve in the Provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewar.

- Wo person, other than a member of the Onion Lake Indian Band, shall permit any cattle or other domestic animals owned by him or reputed to be in his care or possession to rue at large on any part of the Onion Lake Indian Reserve.
- The chief, or any other person authorized by the council of the band, may cause any cattle or other animals found runaing at large on the reserve to be removed therefrom.
- (c) If any person, other than a member of the band, permits sur mottle or animals owned by him or in his care or possession to trespass on the reserve, such person may be required orally or in writing by the chief, or any person authorized by the council of the band, to remove such cattle or other minals from the reserve within forty-eight hours.
- If any paraco, after he has been notified as afgresaid, dues not remove such cattle or other animals from the reserve, orafter any cattle or other animals owned by him or in him cars and possession have been removed, causes or permits any cattle or other animals owned by him or in his care or possization to return to said reserve, he shall be deemed, guilty of a breach of the provisions of this by-law.

May person who violates any of the provisions of this by-lat shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on specition to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars or impresonment for a term not exceeding thirty days, or both

fine and imprisonment.
