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#### TRESPASSER REMOVAL BY-LAW

By-law No. 1992-2 of the Fort McMurray Indian Band

A BY-LAW FOR THE REMOVAL AND
PUNISHMENT OF PERSONS TRESPASSING OR
FREQUENTING THE RESERVE FOR
PROHIBITED PURPOSES CAREE

ENACTED ON THE 18 DAY OF August 19 52

WHEREAS the Council of the Fort McMurray Indian Band desires to establish a by-law to provide for the removal and punishment of persons trespassing on the reserve or frequenting the reserve for prohibited purposes

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Fort McMurray Indian Band is empowered to make such by-law, and any matter ancillary thereto pursuant to section 81(1)(p), (q) and (r) of the Indian Act;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed to be expedient and necessary, for the benefit, comfort and safety of the inhabitants of the reserve, to provide for the removal and punishment of persons trespassing on the reserve or frequenting the reserve for prohibited purposesses and

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Fort McMurray Indian Band hereby makes the following by-law:

#### Short title

1. This by-law may be cited as "Reserve Trespasser Refusal or Fallure To Leave Bylaw".

#### Interpretation

2. In this by-law

"Council" means the Council of the Fort McMurray Indian Band as defined in the Indian Act;

"Minister" means the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development;

"officer" means appolice officer, police constable, or other person charged by the Crown in Right of Canada, the Crown in Right of Alberta or the Council with the duty to preserve and maintain the public peace;

"reserve" means the reserve of the Fort McMurray Indian Band and includes the Fort McMurray Indian Band's Reserves No. 176, 176A and 176B;

## Prohibited Purposes

- 3.(1) A person, other than a person referred to in subsection (2), who conducts on the reserve any of the following activities, namely:
  - (a) hunting, fishing or trapping;
  - (b) hawking or peddling of wares or merchandise;
  - (c) loltering;
  - (d) soliciting financial assistance;

shall be deemed to be frequenting the reserve for a prohibited purpose.

- (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to
  - (a) a person who is a lawful resident of the reserve; or
  - (b) a person who under a By-Law of the Council, holds a valid licence to conduct any activity referred to thereint or is otherwise permitted to conduct that activity. Sometid from previous bylaw)
- 4.(1) An officer may order any person who trespasses on the reserve or who frequents the reserve for a prohibited purpose to leave the reserve immediately.

- (2) Where a person who has been ordered to leave the reserve fails or refuses to do so, an officer may take such reasonable measures as may be necessary to remove the person from the reserve.
- (3) No person shall fail or refuse to comply immediately with an order made under subsection (1) to leave the reserve, or shall resist or interfere with an officer acting under subsection (2).

# <u>Penalty</u>

5. A person who violates s.4(3) of this by-law commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$1,000.00 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days, or to both.

## Repeal

6.

This by-Law is HEREBY made at a duly convened meeting of the Band Council of the Fort McMurray Indian Band

this 18 day of August , 19 92.
