


I HEREBY declare the following by-law made by the Council of the Blood Band of Indians in the Province of Alberta at a meeting held April 8, 1959, to be in force:

By-law No. 4 - A by-law to provide for the regulation and use of the new Blood Band Community Hall on the Blood Indian Reserve, Province of Alberta.

The Council of the Flood Band of Indians at a meeting held
Wednesday Apr 8/59. makes the following by-law pursuant
to paragraphs (d) and (r) of Section 80 of the Indian Act.

By-law No. 4

A by-law to provide for the regulation and use of the new Flood
Band Community Hall on the Flood Indian Reserve.

(a) No person shall loiter in or on the premises of the new
Flood Band Community Hall.

(b) No person shall park or cause to be parked any vehicle within
100 feet of the new Flood Band Community Hall except in an area
designated and marked for parking by the Band Council.

(c) Any person who violates any of the provisions of this by-law
shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to
a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars or imprisonment for a term not
exceeding thirty days, or both fine and imprisonment.
