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HAISLA NATION RATES BY-LAW, 2021

WHEREAS pursuant to the *Indian Act*, R.S.C. 1985, and specifically paragraph 83(1)(a) of the *Indian Act*, 1985, c.I-5, the Council of a Band may make by-laws for the purpose of taxation for local purposes of land, or interests in land, including rights to occupy, possess or use land in a reserve and with respect to any matter arising out of or ancillary to such purpose; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Haisla Nation enacted the *Haisla Nation Property Assessment and Taxation By-Law* on July 25, 2006, as amended by the *Haisla Property Assessment and Taxation Amendment By-Law No. 01-2007*; the *Haisla Nation Property Assessment and Taxation Amendment By-Law 01-2011*; and the *Haisla Nation Property and Taxation Amendment By-Law 01-2017*; and


IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the following by-law be and is hereby enacted pursuant to the provisions of the *Indian Act*, and in particular section 83(1) for the purpose of establishing annual rates of taxation:

1. This by-law may be cited for all purposes as the *Haisla Nation Rates By-Law, 2021*; and
2. Pursuant to Section 11 of the *Haisla Nation Property Assessment and Taxation By-Law*, the tax rates for each class of property shall be in accordance with Schedule "A" which is attached and forms part of the 2021 Rates By-Law.

This Resolution was consented to at a duly convened meeting of Haisla Nation Council on June 24, 2021
