## Washagamis Bay Band of Indians.

## By-law number 3.

.....

A By-law to authorize the seizure of vehicles used to trespass on Rat Portage Reserve No. 38A.

- 1. WHEREAS By-law number 1 of Washagamis Bay Band, which Band is hereinafter called "THE BAND", makes provision for the regulation of traffic within the said Reserve.
- 2. AND WHEREAS the Band is informed that persons who enter upon the said Reserve without proper cause are trespassers thereon.
- 3. AND WHEREAS there exists a road through the said Reserve, and other roads, and the Band has been informed by Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development that the said roads are private roads.
- 4. AND WHEREAS in passing this By-law the Chief and Council of the Band acts in reliance upon the said information given by the said Department.
- 5. AND WHEREAS the Band is concerned that persons trespass upon the said Reserve by using the said roads.
- 6. AND WHEREAS Clause p of Section 81 of The Indian Act empowers the Chief and Council of the Band to make by-laws for the removal and punishment of persons trespassing upon the Reserve or frequenting the Reserve.
- 7. NOW THEREFOR BE IT ENACTED, AND IT IS HEREBY ENACTED, by the Council of Washagamis Bay Band as follows:

- 8. Any person reasonablly believed to be trespassing upon the said Reserve may be removed therefrom by any peace officer or by any member of the Band from time to time authorized by the Council of the Band so to do, but no unreasonable force shall be used in so doing.
- 9. Every vehicle, fire arm, boat, trailer, fishing equipment and chattle of every nature or kind whatsoever found on the said Reserve and in the custody or possession of, or under the control of, a person or persons reaspnably believed to be trespassing upon the said Reserve, may be seized by or for the Band and shall be delt with or disposed of as the Council of the Band may from time to time and at any time decide.
