

THE MARTIN FALLS BAND OF INDIANS

BY-LAW NO. 2

Being a by-law to control the use of recreational facilities on the Reserve.

WHEREAS under Sections 81(d) and 81 (m) of the Indian Act R.S.C. 149, S.1 the Council of the Band is empowered to make by-laws for "the prevention of disorderly conduct and nuisances" and "the control and prohibition of public games, sports, races, athletic contests and other amusements."

AND WHEREAS it is considered that the prohibition of gambling in public facilities on the reserve will be conducive to the maintenance of law and order.


NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Martin Falls Band of Indians enacts as a by-law thereof the following:


- (1) In this by-law:
 - (a) "Council" means the Council of the Martin Falls Band of Indians.
 - (b) "Reserve" means the Martin Falls Indian Reserve No. 65, set apart for the use of the Band.
 - (c) "Gambling" means playing games of chance for money stake.
 - (d) "Betting" means risking money on the outcome of an event.
 - (e) "Public building" means any building or annex thereto, whether or not owned by the Band, which is generally considered available for public use.
- (2) No person shall carry on gambling or betting within any public building on the reserve, or using any equipment situate in such public building.

Any person found violating the provision of this by-law shall be guilty of an offense, and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty dollars or imprisonment for a period not exceeding five days or to both such fine and imprisonment.
