

By-law respecting street lights on the Caughnawaga Indian Reserve.
Section 31 (9)

WHEREAS it is in order for the prevention of disorderly conduct and nuisances and for the observance of law and order to provide for the regulation and punishment of any person who may commit a mischief in connection with street lights on the territory of the Caughnawaga Indian Reserve.

IT IS RESOLVED THAT:

1. Every one who wilfully
 - A) Destroys or damages,
 - B) Renders dangerous, useless and inoperative or ineffective any street by-law on the territory of the Caughnawaga Indian Reserve will be punishable by summary conviction:
 - a) to a fine of \$50.00 for the first offence;
 - b) to a fine of \$100.00 for the second offence;
 - c) to a fine of \$100.00 and imprisonment for a term not exceeding 30 days for a third subsequent offence.
2. Any police officer of the Band will have the authority to arrest at sight any person who violates this by-law and seize any article, apparatus used in connection with the commitment of this offence;
3. The Court, may on application made before it, issue an order to confiscate the article or apparatus seized above.
4. This by-law shall come into force on the day that it is declared to be in force by the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development or on the 40th day following the transmission of the present by-law to the said Minister, whichever is the sooner.
5. Upon coming into force of this by-law, all other by-laws dealing with the matters provided herein or inconsistent with the present by-law, shall be repealed.
