T R A F F I C B Y - L A W

The Brunswick House Band Traffic By-Law

Whereas, Sections 81 (1) (b), (c), (q) and (r) of the Indian Act empowers the Council of a Band to make by-laws for the regulation of traffic, any ancillary matters and the imposition of a penalty for the violation of the by-law;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the Brunswick House Band enacts as a by-law as follows:

1. No person shall operate any vehicle in excess of 25km/hr in the residential area of the Brunswick House Reserve # 76B, commonly known as Duck Lake.
2. No person shall operate any vehicle in a manner dangerous to public safety or to property, in the residential area of the Brunswick House Reserve # 76B, commonly known as Duck Lake.
3. Any person who is suspected of breaking this by-law may be given a warning by the police.
4. Any person who violates this by-law is guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction;
 - a) for a first offence, to a prohibition from driving on Brunswick House Reserve # 76B, for a period of up to three months; and
 - b) for a subsequent offence, a fine of up to \$500.00 or imprisonment of up to 15 days or both.

Approved and passed at a duly convened meeting of the Council of the Brunswick House Band this 11th day of April, 1986.
