B Y - L A W

The Brunswick House Law and Order By-Law

Whereas Section 81 of the Indian Act empowers a Council of a Band of Indians to make By-Laws and the imposition of a penalty for violation of the by-laws;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Brunswick House Band of Indians enacts as a by-law as follows:

- 1) No person shall remove, deface, destroy, damage, mutilate or in any manner whatsoever vandalize public property on the reserve.
- 2) No person shall remove, deface, destroy, damage, mutilate or in any manner whatsoever vandalize private property on the reserve.
- 3) Where a minor commits any of the acts in Section 1 or Section 2 the parents of the minor shall be responsible for paying for any of the damages to the property.
- 4) Any person who violates any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$ 1000.00 or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days or to both fine and imprisonment.
- 5) By-law 1(SOR/72-348), By-law 2(SOR/72-349), By-law 3(SOR/72-350) and By-law 4(SOR/72-351) of the Brunswick House Band are hereby repealed.
