FORT WARE INDIAN BAND BY-LAW NUMBER 3-1986 BEING AN INTOXICANTS BY-LAW

WHEREAS Section 85.1 of the Indian Act enables the council of a Band to make by-laws to protect its residents from the presence of intoxicants on its reserve lands, and to impose penalties for the violation of such by-laws;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Fort Ware Indian Band considers it necessary to establish an intoxicants by-law for the protection of the inhabitants of the reserves of the Fort Ware Indian Band from the presence of intoxicants;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Fort Ware Indian Band hereby enacts as a by-law thereof as follows:

1. In this by-law

- (a) "intoxicant" includes alcohol, alcoholic, spitituous, vinous, fermented malt or other intoxicating liquor or combination of liquors and mixed liquor a part of which is spirituous, vinous, fermented or otherwise intoxicating and all drinks or drinkable liquids and all preparations or mixtures capable of human consumption that are intoxicating;
- (b) "reserve" means a tract of land, the legal title to which is vested in Her Majesty, that has been set apart by Her Majesty for the use and benefit of the Fort Ware Indian Band.

2.	No person shall sell, barter, supply or manufacture
	intoxicants on any reserves of the Fort Ware Indian
	Band.

- 3. No person shall be under the influence of an intoxicant on any reserves of the Fort Ware Indian Band.
- 4. No person shall be in possession of intoxicants on a reserve of the Fort Ware Indian Band.
- 5. Any person who violates any of the provisions as set out in section 2 of the by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of not more than one thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both.
- 6. Any person who violates any of the provisions as set out in section 3 and section 4 of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of not more than one hundred dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to both.
