I HEREBY declare the following by-law made by the Council of the Kispiox Band of Indians in the Province of British Columbia, to be in force:

By-law No. 11 - A by-law to provide for the maintenance of a water system within the Kispiox Indian Reserve No. 1 in the Province of British Columbia and provision of a tax.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY

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1. The control and management o' the Elgin Bon' Waterworks shall be under the direction o' the Elgin Bon' Council.
2. No person shall tap or make any connections whatever with any o' the pipes or mains o' the said system without permission o' the Elgin Bon' Council.
3. The same, implement o' fact by the Council, shall introduce with any faucet, valve, stopcock, pipe or other waterworks appliance outside o' his own premises.
4. Any water connection from the street line into any premises shall be made at the cost o' the applicant.
5. Persons introducing water service into their own premises and the person doing the work will be required to cause the said service to be placed not less than four (4) feet below the surface of the ground throughout the distance between the street line and the inside o' the foundation wall o' the building into which the water service is introduced.
6. Every service pipe shall be provided by the user or occupant with a brass "stop and waste cock" of a pattern to be approved by the Council, which cock shall be placed immediately inside the outer wall o' the building on line.
7. The user shall use only taps, pipes, fittings and plumbing fixtures which are in a satisfactory condition and have been approved by the Council.
8. The diameter o' the standard service pipe and standard taps shall not exceed three-quarter inch.
9. Water shall not be turned on to any premises until the installation o' the pipes, etc. has been completed to the satisfaction o' the Council or an inspector appointed by the Council. A charge o' .50/- shall be made for the turning on the water to any property.

10. A person so appointed and authorized by the Council may enter any building connected with the water system at any convenient time to examine pipes and fixtures and to inspect water consumed to the quantity of water used and the manner of its use.
11. Every user shall keep his service pipes, stopcocks and other fixtures on his premises and from the line of street or line, in good order and repair and at his expense. In the case of leaky or faulty fixtures the Council may shut off the supply of water until such defective pipes or other fixtures are repaired or altered as required. In no case shall any user have a claim on the band or Council by reason of such shutting off of the water.
12. When it is necessary to make repairs to the main lines or to construct new works, the Council reserves the right to shut off the water from any user and keep it shut off as long as may be necessary.
13. Where boilers are supplied with water the Council will not be liable for any damage resulting from the shutting off of the supply of water.
14. Any user vacating any premises supplied with water from the water system or who is desirous of discontinuing the service supplied, must give a reasonable notice of the same in writing to the Council or the band or Indian Superintendent. In the case of failure to give such notice the user will be held liable for the rates therefore and for any damage that may result.
15. The several rates and charges set forth in the schedule which forms part of these regulations, shall be the rates and charges for water supplied from the Kispiox Water System and all such rates and charges shall be payable yearly in advance on September 1st.

16. (a) At the expiration of one month after the rates or charges are due on any premise, the water may at the option of the Council, be shut off and it shall not be turned on except on payment of all rates and charges, together with the fee of .50/- paid for the shutting off and .50/- paid for the turning on.
- (b) The Council may shut the water off from the premises of any user who infringes any of these regulations and may refuse to turn the water on again until satisfied and assured that the user will comply with these regulations.
17. A water bailiff shall be appointed from time to time by the Board Council as required and shall be responsible for the administration of these regulations and the collection of fees as set out in the schedule and shall make recommendations to the Board Council concerning any matter which may arise in the administration of these regulations and shall receive remuneration as set out in the schedule of fees attached to and forming part of these regulations.

The Council of the Kispiox Band at a meeting held at Kispiox  
makes the following bylaw pursuant to sections 11,  
(c) and (v) of section 20 and paragraphs (c) and (v) of subsection  
(1) of section 20 of the Indian Act.

Section No. 11.

A bylaw to regulate the maintenance of a water  
system within the Kispiox Indian Reserve No. 1 in the  
Province of British Columbia and provision of a tax.

- (a) The Kispiox Band Waterworks System shall be under the  
control of the Kispiox Band Council, which has passed  
the attached regulations for the control and management  
of the said waterworks system and which regulations form  
part of this bylaw and shall be in effect from the date of  
the passing of this bylaw, a copy of which regulations is  
duly recorded in the office of the Indian Superintendent.
- (b) In addition to the penalties provided in the said  
regulations, any person who violates any of the provisions  
of this bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and shall be  
liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten  
dollars (\$10.00) or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding  
seven days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

DO HEREBY RESOLVE:

5. The owner of any poolroom may form a private club, open to persons not less than eighteen years of age, and that such a club be permitted to play pool disregarding Section 2 of this by-law.
6. The each club member shall pay an annual fee, as set out in Appendix "A" of this by-law, and that such fees shall be paid into the funds of the Kispaiox Band.
7. That the owner of every poolroom shall purchase a licence annually from the Kispaiox Band Council, the licence fees being set out in Appendix "A" of this by-law, the money realized from the licence to be paid into the funds of the Kispaiox Band

SCHEME OF FEES

KISPIOK BAND WATER WORKS SYSTEM

1. Every user shall pay a water rate of Twelve Dollars (\$12.00) per year into the funds of the Kispiok Band, and this shall include any person who, not having water taken into his own premises, draws it from the premises of one who has.
2. The Sheriff shall be entitled in consideration of the performance of all his duties 10% of the total rates collected from the funds of the Kispiok Band.
