

The Council of the Kispiox Band of Indians at a meeting held March 1,
1961 (date) makes the following by-law pursuant to subsection
(1)(e) and subsection (1)(f) of Section 82 of the Indian Act.

By-law No. 10,

April 12, 1961

A by-law to provide for the raising of money to defray the cost of
street lighting on the Kispiox Indian Reserve #1 in the Province of British
Columbia.

1. In this by-law,
 - (a) "Council of the Band" means the Council of the Kispiox Band of Indians;
 - (b) "male occupant" means any male person ordinarily resident on the Reserve who has reached the full age of 21 years;
 - (c) "Reserve" means the Kispiox Indian Reserve #1;
 - (d) "Secretary of the Council" means the person appointed by the Council of the Band for the purposes of this by-law.
2. The cost of street lighting on the Reserve shall be defrayed by an assessment to be levied upon all male occupants.
3. The Council of the Band not later than the first day of October in each year, shall prepare an estimate of the amount of money required to defray the cost of street lighting on the Reserve for the 12 months period following this date.
4. The assessment of each male occupant shall be determined by dividing the amount of money estimated pursuant to paragraph 3 by the total number of male occupants.
5. The Secretary of the Council shall, within fifteen days after the Council of the Band has determined the assessment of each male occupant, send or give notice of such assessment in the form prescribed by the Council of the Band to each male occupant.
6. The amount of the assessment determined pursuant to paragraph 4 shall be paid by each male occupant to the Secretary of the Council on or before the date specified in the notice of assessment.
7. Any male occupant who fails to pay the assessment in accordance with paragraph 6 shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law and the assessment or any part thereof remaining unpaid shall be recoverable on summary conviction.

8. Moneys raised pursuant to this by-law shall be expended by the Council of the Land for the purposes of defraying the cost of street lighting on the Reserve.
