By-Law #7 apr. 15, 1954

The Council of the KITKATLA Band of Indians at a meeting held Tartick 1954.

makes the following bylaw pursuent to paragraph (n) and (r) of section 80, and paragraph (a) (i) of subsection one of section 82 of the Indian Act.

Bylaw No. 7

A bylaw to provide for the regulation of the conduct and activities of hawkers, peddlers or others who enter the KITKATLA Indian Reserve in the Frevince of BRPTISH COLUMBIA to buy or sell or otherwise deal in wares or merchandise and the charging of a licence fee therefor.

- Hawkers, peddlers and others carrying on petty trades, or who otherwise deal in weres or merchandise, who go from place to place or to other men's houses on foot or with any animal or bicycle, motor cycle, automobile or other vehicle bearing or drawing any goods, wares or merchandise for sale shall before doing business within the reserve take out a licence and pay a fee of five dollars therefor to the Kikhtla Council Tremsing which licence shall not be transfor ble and shall expire at the end of the then fiscal (or calendar) year and may be renewed from your to year upon the payment of the required fee. The term "hawkers, poddlers, and others" shall, in addition, extend to and include any transient person who solicits or takes orders for hardware, groceries, dry goods, clothing, proprietary medicines, small goods, or enlarged photographs from a customer for future delivery.
- (b) No licence shall be required by a member of the band under this bylaw.
- shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding seven days, or both fine and imprisonment.
