The Council of The Pas Band of Indians at a meeting held this 29th day of May, 1979, hereby enacts by-law number 12 to provide for the regulation of Bee Keeping within the boundaries of The Pas Indian Reserve in the Province of Manitoba.

WHEREAS, paragraphs (k) and (r) of Section 81 of the Indian Act empowers the Council of a Band to provide for the regulation of beekeeping and the imposition of a penalty for a violation thereof, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be expedient to control the activities of beekeepers for the welfare and safety of residents of The Pas Indian Reserve.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Pas Band of Indians enacts as a bylaw thereof the following:

- In this by-law,
 - (a) "Council of the Band" means the Council of The Pas Band of Indians,
 - (b) "Reserve" means the tract of land as defined in the Indian Act,
 - (c) "Hives" means bee hives.
- 2. All persons engaging in Beekeeping must conform to the provincial standards (Chapter Blt, The Bee Act).
- 3. No person shall place or cause to be placed hives upon the Reserve without the written consent of the Band Council.
- 4. No person shall place or cause to be placed hives near a dwelling house without the occupants express permission.
- 5. No person shall without lawful excuse, the proof of which lies upon him, prowl or loiter by day or night upon the site where hives are located.
- 6. The Band Council shall authorize the owner of hives to place and maintain or cause to be placed or maintained warning signs indicating the distance and location of hives.
- 7. No person shall interfere with or attempt to interfere with by removing, defacing, or altering any authorized bee signs within The Pas Indian Reserve.
- 8. No person shall molest or destroy or attempt to molest hives within The Pas Indian Reserve.
- 9. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$100.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty (30) days or both fine and imprisonment.

Approved and passed at a duly convened meeting of the Council of The Pas Band of Indians this 29th day of May, 1979.
