THE LAKE ST. MARTIN BAND OF INDIANS

BY-LAW NO. 1-73

Being a by-law for the removal and punishment of persons who trespass or frequent the Reserve for purposes not conducive to the well-being of the Reserve inhabitants.

WHEREAS Paragraphs (p) and (r) of Section 80 of the Indian Act empower the Band Council to make by-laws respecting the removal and punishment of persons trespassing upon the Reserve or frequenting the Reserve for prescribed purposes and the imposition of a penalty for the violation thereof;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to limit the access of certain undesirable persons for the protecting and well being of the Reserve Residents of the Lake St. Martin Indian Reserve.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Lake St. Martin Band of Indians enacts the following by-law:

- (1) In this by-law,
 - (a) "Council" means the Council, as defined in the Indian Act, of the Lake St. Martin Band of Indians.
 - (b) "Reserve" means the tract of land set apart by Her Majesty

 within the definition of the Indian Act, for the use and benefit

 of the Lake St. Martin Indian Band.
 - (c) "Trespass" means to enter unlawfully upon the Lake St. Martin

 Indian Reserve after notice of trespassing has been served.
- (2) The notice of trespassing shall be served by registered mail and/or delivered by hand to those persons who in the opinion of the Lake St.

 Martin Band Council are undesirable, and found to be trespassing.
- (3) Any person who violates any provision of this by-law shall be guilty of an offense and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days, or both fine and imprisonment.
