

STRAY DOGS BY-LAW

By-Law #1991.02 of the Little Black River First Nation respecting stray dogs.

WHEREAS the Council of the Little Black River First Nation desires to establish a By-Law governing the protection against and prevention of trespass by dogs onto the grounds of the Little Black River School; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Little Black River First Nation is em-powered to make a By-Law governing the protection against and prevention of trespass by dogs, and any matter ancillary thereto and the imposition of a penalty for the violation thereof pursuant to paragraphs 81(1)(e), (g), and (r) of the Indian Act.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Little Black River First Nation hereby enacts as a By-Law governing the protection against and prevention of trespass by dogs onto the grounds of the Little Black River School; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Little Black River First Nation is em-powered to make a By-Law governing the protection against and prevention of trespass by dogs, and any matter ancillary thereto and the imposition of a penalty for the violation thereof pursuant to paragraphs 81(1)(e), (q), and (r) of the Indian Act.

Now therefore the Council of the Little Black River First Nation hereby enacts as a By-Law thereof the following:

1. In this By-Law:

- (a) "Council" means the Council as defined in the Indian Act
- (b) "grounds of the Little Black River School" means the buildings of the actual school in addition to the
- (c) "owner" shall include harbourer or possessor.

2. No owner of a dog shall allow the same to roam within the grounds of the Little Black River School unattended.

3. Following the third violation, should the dog again be dis-covered on the Little Black School grounds it will be de-stroyed.

4. While within the territory of the Little Black River First Nation, if a dog bites a person, it shall be destroyed immediately.

AND WHEREAS the violation of By-Law #1991.02 upon summary conviction may result in the imposition of a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) or a term of imprisonment not exceeding five days (5), or both,

Be it know that this By-Law entitled "Stray Dogs" is hereby enacted as By-Law #1991.02 by the Council of the Little Black River First Nation at a duly convened meeting of the said Council held on the 25th day of February, 1991.
