

By-Law # 2
Amended

The Council of the Caughnawaga Band of Indians at a meeting held Oct 15th 1964, make the following by-law pursuant to paragraphs (c) and (r) of section 80 of the Indian Act.

By-law No. 2

A by-law for the protection, preservation and management of fur bearing animals, fish and game on the Caughnawaga Indian reserve in the Province of Quebec.

1. No person, other than a member of the Caughnawaga Band of Indians or Indians from other Bands accompanied by Caughnawaga Indians shall trap, fish or hunt within the boundaries of Caughnawaga Indian Reserve.
2. No member of the Caughnawaga Band shall invite or accompany any person who is not a member of the above mentioned band except Indians from other Bands onto the above-mentioned Reserve for the purpose of trapping, fishing or hunting.

ENFORCEMENT

3. The Chief and Councillors of the Band, Indian Constable(s), Royal Canadian Mounted Police and any other person or persons named by the Council shall be ex-officio officers for the enforcement of this by-law.
4. Any officer for the enforcement of this by-law shall forthwith seize all fish or game protected by this by-law which
 - (a) is found by him in possession of any person other than as above specified;
 - (b) appears to have been taken by some unlawful means and shall bring such game or fish before a police magistrate, stipendiary magistrate or person appointed by the Governor in Council to be a Justice of the Peace for offences under the Indian Act.

The Council of the Caughnawaga Band of Indians at a meeting held
Oct. 1st, 1964, and the Council of the Oka Band at a meeting held
November 3, 1964, make the following by-law pursuant to paragraphs
(o) and (r) of section 80 of the Indian Act.

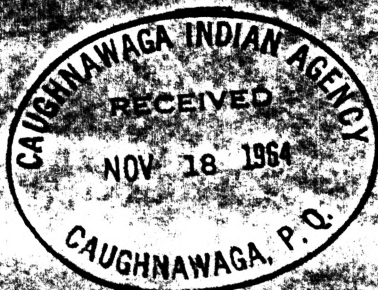
By-law No. 2A

A by-law for the protection, preservation and management of fur
bearing animals, fish and game on the Doncaster Indian Reserve No. 17
in the Province of Quebec.

1. No person, other than a member of the Caughnawaga or Oka Band of
Indians or Indians from other Bands accompanied by Caughnawaga
or Oka Indians shall trap, fish or hunt within the boundaries of
the Doncaster Indian Reserve No. 17.
2. No member of the Caughnawaga or Oka Bands shall in its or her-
self or any person who is not a member of the above-mentioned bands
except Indians from other bands onto the above-mentioned Reserve
for the purpose of trapping, fishing or hunting.

ENFORCEMENT

3. The Chiefs and Councillors of the Bands, Indian constables, Royal
Canadian Mounted Police and any other person or persons named by
the Councils shall be ex-officio officers for the enforcement of
this by-law.
4. Any officer for the enforcement of this by-law shall forthwith
seize all game or fish protected by this by-law which
(a) is found by him in possession of any person other than a mem-
ber of the Bands;
(b) appears to have been taken by some unlawful means and shall
bring such game or fish before a police magistrate, stipendiary
magistrate or person appointed by the Governor in Council to
be a Justice of the peace for offences under the Indian Act.



5. Where a person is convicted under this by-law, the convicting court or judge may order that the game and fish, in addition to any penalty imposed, are forfeited to Her Majesty for the benefit of the band, provided, that the meat or fish so forfeited shall be delivered to a charitable institution designated by the Council.

PENALTIES

6. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this by-law shall on summary conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding One Hundred (\$100.00) dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty (30) days or to both fine and imprisonment.
