RESPECTING By Law No. 3 Respecting Use of Public Wells, Cisterns, Reservoirs, and Other Water Supplies

The Millbrook Band

WHEREAS section 81, paragraphs (a), (c),(d), (q) and (r), of the *Indian Act* empower the Council of a Band of Indians to pass by-laws to provide for the health of residents on the reserve, the observance of Law and order, the prevention of nuisances, matters arising out of or ancillary to the exercise of powers under this section, and the imposition of a penalty for the violation of any such by-law;

WHEREAS the Council of the Millbrook Band did enact By-law No. 3 setting down rules for the protection of Drinking Wells, Cisterns, Reservoirs and Other Water Supplies on the 30th day of November, 1970, pursuant to paragraphs 81 (a), (c), (d) and (q) and (r) of the *Indian Act*;

AND WHEREAS the said Council is of the opinion that such a by-law is not required at this time;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Millbrook Band enacts as a by-law thereof the following:

1. By-Law No. 3, enacted on the 30th day of November, 1970 and being a *By-Law* for the Use of Public Wells, Cisterns, Resevoirs, and Other Water Supplies, be and the same is hereby repealed.
