of Indians at a meeting held at the Office of Chief makes the following bylaw pursuant to paragraph (1) and (r) of section 80 of The Indian Act.

## Bylaw No. (2)

A bylaw to provide for the regulation of the use of public wells, cisterns, reservoirs and other water supplies.

- No person shall wilfully or maliciously pollute any public well, cistern, reservoir or other water supply within the TOBIQUE

- of or on the shores of any waters lying within the reserve any night-soil, garbage, manure, offal, dead animal matter, decaying vegetable matter or any substance or substances which in any way may contaminate such waters and tend to make the waters therefrom unfit for human consumption.
- (c) Any person who violates any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding seven days, or both fine and imprisonment,
