Bylaw No. 1.

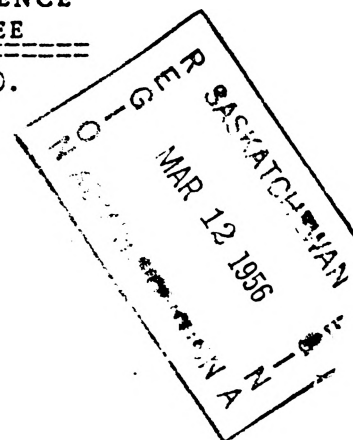
A bylaw to provide for the licencing of businesses, callings,
trades and occupations within the White Bear Indian Reserve,
in the province of Saskatchewan.

(a) No person shall conduct or carry on any business, calling, trade
or occupation as listed herein who is not the holder of a valid and
subsisting licence for the business, calling, trade or occupation issued
pursuant to this bylaw.

(b) There shall be paid at the time of the application for a licence
a fee in the amount as set out hereunder, which licence may be renewed
from year to year upon payment of the required fee.

(c) Any person who violates any of the provisions of this bylaw shall
be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to
a fine not exceeding Twenty Five dollars or imprisonment
for a term not exceeding thirty days, or both fine and
imprisonment.
