DO HEREBY RESOLVE: **To amend section four (4) and sub-section (b) of By-Law No. 13**

A by-law for the protection, preservation and management of fur bearing animals, fish and game on the Restigouche Indian Reserve in the Province of Quebec.

This By-Law was made at a meeting held the 17th day of April, 1967, pursuant to paragraphs (c) and (r) of section 80 of the Indian Act.

By-Law No. 13 (section (4) to be amended as follows:)

- (4) Any officer for the enforcement of this by-law shall forthwith seize all fish, game and equipment protected by this by-law which:
- (a) is found by him in possession of any person other than as above specified;
 - (b) appears to have been taken by some unlawful means and shall bring such fish, game and equipment before a police magistrate, stipendiary magistrate or person appointed by the Governor in Council to be a Justice of the Peace for offences under the Indian Act.

The Council of the Restigouche Band of Indians at a meeting held this 17th day of April, 1967, make the following by-law pursuant to paragraphs (c) and (r) of section 80 of the Indian Act.

By-Law No. 13

A by-law for the protection, preservation and management of fur bearing animals, fish and game on the Restigouche Indian reserve in the Province of Quebec.

- (1) No person other than an Indian shall trap, fish or hunt within the boundaries of the Restigouche Indian reserve.
- (2) No person other than an Indian shall invite or accompany any person who is not an Indian for the purpose of trapping, fishing or hunting.

ENFORCEMENT

- (3) The Chief and Councillors of the Band, Indian Constable (s), Royal Canadian Mounted Police and any other person or persons named by the Council shall be ex-officio officers for the enforcement of this by-law.
- (4) Any officer for the enforcement of this by-law shall forthwith seize all fish, game and equipment protected by this by-law which:
 - (a) is found by him in possession of any person other than as above specified;
 - (b) appears to have been taken by some unlawful means and shall bring such fish, game and equipment before a police magistrate, stipendiary magistrate or person appointed by the Governor in Council to be a Justice of the Peace for offences under the Indian Act.
- (5) Where a person is convicted under this by-law, the convicting court or judge may order that the game and fish, in addition to any penalty imposed, are forfeited to Her Majesty for the benefit of the Band, provided that the meat or fish so forfeited shall be delivered to a charitable institution designated by the Council.

PENALTIES

- (6) Any person who violates any provisions of this by-law shall on summary conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding One hundred (\$100.00) dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty (30) days or both fine and imprisonment.

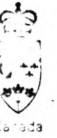



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The Council of the Restigouche Band of Indians at a meeting held this 29 day of June, 1967, make the following by-law pursuant to paragraph (h) of section 80 of the Indian Act.

By-Law No. 14

In respect to the regulation and use of the Micmac Community Centre owned by the Band.

1. (A) \$15.00 - Rental fee for authorized clubs, committees or organizations.
- (B) \$10.00 - When giving baby showers or bridal showers.
- (C) \$30.00 - For banquets.

Five dollars will be repayable to any authorized organizations if they thoroughly clean up after they have used the Community Centre.
The Janitor will be paid five dollars if left uncleaned.

2. The rental fee for Seminars will be - \$25.00 per day.
3. For entertaining purposes given by other than authorized clubs, committees or organizations the rental fee will be not less than forty percent (40%)
4. Registered youth groups, like Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, Brownies or Girl Guides will be free to use the Community Centre upon holding weekly meetings.
5. Free movies will be shown to the children on certain days.
6. One special entertainment twice a month for our Community Centre. It may be a bingo, dance or movie. All proceeds will be for the Centre.
7. The Band Council upon holding Public meetings or weekly meetings will be free to use the Community Centre.
8. The opening hours for the Community Centre will be as follows:
1 p.m. to 1 a.m. during the fall and winter months.
1 p.m. to 2 a.m. during the summer months.
9. Children under twelve will not be admitted unless accompanied by a parent or guardian when there is entertainment during the evenings.
10. There will always be two constables to look after the Community Centre and protect the parked cars of visitors. They will be paid by the Community Centre.
11. Non-Indians or Indians other than Band members will get the same protection when there is entertainment as Band members.
12. There will be no discrimination to any existing organizations that may wish to use the Community Centre, or for anyone that will benefit by using it.
13. No intoxicating beverages will be allowed at anytime in the Community Centre.
14. This by-law is subject to amendments for the betterment of our Community Centre and to be in fairness to all who wish to use it.
15. It is the intention of this by-law to promote a relationship that will bring us closer to each other and work together to maintain a Community that we can be proud of.
