The Council of the Paul Indian Band at a meeting held this day of January 14, 1970 make the following by-law pursuant to paragraphs (c) and (d) of s.80 of the Indian Act.

By-law No. 2

A by-law to provide for the observance of law and order and for the prevention of disorderly conduct and nuisance on the Wabamun Indian Reserve in the Province of Alberta.

- In this by-law, "public place" includes any place to which the public have access as of right or by invitation express or implied.
- No person shall cause a disturbance in or near a public place 2. (a) by fighting, screaming, shouting, swearing, singing, or using insulting or obscene language;
 - (b) by being drunk, or
 - (c) by impeding or molesting other persons.
- No person shall openly expose or exhibit an indecent exhibition in a public place or commit any act in a public place which offends against public decency or order.
- 4. No person shall loiter in a public place or in any way obstruct persons who are there.
- No person shall disturb the peace and quiet of the occupants 5. of a dwelling house by discharging fire-arms, or by other disorderly conduct in a public place, or dwelling house.
- No person shall without lawful excuse, the proof of which lies upon him, prowl or loiter by day or by night upon the property of another person near a dwelling house situated on that property without the owner's permission either express or implied.
- Any person who violates any provision of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$100.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 30 days or both fine and imprisonment.
