PRESCRIBED TAX RATES FOR THE TAXATION YEAR 2009

The Council of Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation hereby adopts the following taxation rates for the 2009 taxation year for the following classes of property.

BE IT KNOWN that this By-law entitled "The Rates Bylaw" which forms part of the Taxation By-law passed by Chief and Council and approved by the Minister May 25, 1994, that being a By-law to establish a By-law system on the reserve lands of Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation for the fair and equitable taxation for local purposes of Land, or Interests in Land including the rights to occupy, possess or use lands within the boundaries of the reserve is hereby enacted as By-law 2009-T01 by the Chief and Council of Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation.


