

- 1. This bylaw may be cited for all purposes as the "Exemption Bylaw 1998"

Any person having property assessed by the head assessor pursuant to the Assessment Bylaw as being in Class 5 (Light industry) or Class 6 (Business/Other) shall be exempt from the payment of taxes In an amount equivalent to the gross assessed value of improvement being \$5,000 00 less than as stated in the roll authenticated pursuant to the Assessment Bylaw
